They give us a wonderful view of his power and character. The Jewish namethe God who sees is "El Roi". We only find it once in the Bible, in the history of the servant of Hagar- Sarai. The God who sees God had promised the descendants of Abraham numerous as the stars in heaven. But years and years had passed without children with his wife Sarai. You must have an Egyptian servant, Hagar, and she offered it to Abram to start their family. (This was outside the plan and Hagar was pregnant. Hagar began to despise Will, and in turn, You will suffer from the proud and arrogant attitude of Hagar. Although the plan was all the idea of Sarai, it began to cruelly mistreat Hagar. In distress, Hagar fled into the desert. An angel of the Lord appeared and informed Hagar that his unborn son was a son. He would call it Ishmael (which means "God listens"), "because the Lord has heard of your misery." Gen 16:11 NIV. He also charged her to return to Sarai. He promised to make his descendants as numerous as the stars as well. Genesis 16:13-14 "So, he gave this name to the Lord who sees me. That is why the well was called Beer Lahai Roi, it is still there, between Kadesh and Bered." (NIV) El Roi Meaning Many of the names for God in the Bible begin with "El". El refers to God. "Roi"- (pronounced "ro-ee") is the Hebrew word to "see" or "look". Hagar learned a precious lesson that day while resting in the spring of the desert.
