Read more Report as inappropriate Massive Attack have added a huge Manchester show to their 2025 tour plans - check out details below. The Bristol trip-hop duo - comprising of Robert '3D' Del Naja and Grant 'Daddy G' Marshall - are set to headline the Co-op Live arena on June 5. Pre-sale tickets are available from 10am on Wednesday March 5, and you can sign up to access those here. Alternatively, tickets go on general sale here this Friday (March 7) at 10am. Their newest date falls the day before they top the bill at the inaugural LIDO festival in London's Victoria Park on June 6. As part of their ongoing relationship with clean energy provider Ecotricity, the group's set in the capital will be 100% powered by battery, significantly reducing carbon emissions and local air pollution. Support for their LIDO set will come from AIR, Yasiin Bey and The Alchemist as FORENSICS, and Tirzah, with many more still to be confirmed. The June dates follow Massive Attack's Act 1.5 concert in Bristol last summer, which served as the UK's biggest low-carbon gig ever, and their Act 1.5 "climate action accelerator" shows in Liverpool. The band are vocal advocates for tackling the climate crisis, with both Del Naja and long-term collaborator Mark Donne speaking to NME about the changes they hoped to see across the music industry. "We can't give you details but we're now talking to promoters about taking everything that made Bristol work and moving it into other cities. Potentially a promoter using exactly the same formula for all the series of shows across open spaces in the city for the whole year," Del Naja said, reflecting on the success of the 2024 Bristol show. "That's what we want to happen. There's no point in doing one-off exemplars, we want it to move into these practical areas." Looking ahead to their 2025 schedule, he explained why the band opted out of performing at Coachella. "We said no to Coachella for next year because again, we've been there once, and once was enough," he continued. "It's in Palm Springs. It's a golf resort built on a desert, run on a sprinkler system, using public water supplies. Mental. If you want to see something that's the most ludicrous bit of human behaviour - it's right there." In other Massive Attack news, back in October the band cancelled their US tour - their first in five years - at the last minute due to what they describe as "unforeseen circumstances". Before then, NME attended the aforementioned Bristol event back in August, which aimed to re-envision how concerts can be staged sustainably. "There is some truth in the idea that an iconic, veteran campaigning act like Massive Attack can make things (like bonus trains!) happen that other events might not so easily be able to pull off. And it's true that a switched-on Bristol audience, fresh from electing a Green MP (who is also on-site and speaking on a panel), are likely to be receptive to a concept like this," the report read. "But there have to be some first-movers who push the boundaries and bring everyone else along with them. Massive Attack and their event partners are the first ones to bring all of the pieces of the low-carbon puzzle together. This is what the live music of the future will need to look like everywhere in the end." Besides the concert in Ferrara, Massive Attack will appear on stage in Segrate, on June 18, 2025, and in Gorizia, on June 24, 2025. > Buy Your Ticket Now MASSIVE ATTACK Massive Attack - Concert in Ferrara Massive Attack, the British music collective formed in 1988 in Bristol, is widely regarded as one of the most influential groups in contemporary music. Their pioneering role in the creation and evolution of trip-hop, a genre characterized by its fusion of hip-hop beats, dub, soul, and experimental soundscapes, has cemented their legacy as trailblazers in electronic music. With a career spanning over three decades, the band's work continues to resonate globally, inspiring countless artists and captivating audiences with its unique blend of haunting melodies, politically charged lyrics, and groundbreaking production. The origins of Massive Attack trace back to the Wild Bunch, a Bristol-based sound system that played a mix of reggae, punk, and funk. Founding members Robert "3D" Del Naja, Grant "Daddy G" Marshall, and Andrew "Mushroom" Vowles emerged from this collective, united by a shared passion for music and artistic experimentation. Their debut album, Blue Lines (1991), is often hailed as the birth of trip-hop, with its lush orchestration, slowed-down beats, and melancholic tones creating an atmosphere that was both introspective and electrifying. The album's standout single, Unfinished Sympathy, exemplified Massive Attack's ability to blend emotive vocals with cinematic arrangements, earning critical acclaim and commercial success. Vocalist Shara Nelson's soaring voice, combined with lush string arrangements, set a new standard for electronic music. Massive Attack's subsequent albums demonstrated their commitment to reinvention. Protection (1994) leaned into soulful grooves and collaborations with vocalists like Tracey Thorn, while Mezzanine (1998) marked a darker, more aggressive turn. Featuring the iconic tracks Teardrop and Angel, Mezzanine integrated elements of rock and industrial music, showcasing the band's ability to transcend genre boundaries. The departure of Andrew Vowles following Mezzanine signaled a period of internal turbulence, but Massive Attack continued to push creative boundaries. 100th Window (2003) and Heligoland (2010) revealed a more experimental, stripped-down approach, with collaborations from artists like Horace Andy, Martina Topley-Bird, and Hope Sandoval enriching their sonic palette. Massive Attack's impact extends beyond music. Robert Del Naja, also an accomplished visual artist, has used the band's platform to advocate for social and political causes. From supporting refugee rights to addressing climate change and surveillance, the group has consistently aligned itself with progressive movements. Their live performances often incorporate striking visuals and messages that challenge societal norms, reinforcing their reputation as both cultural and political provocateurs. The influence of Massive Attack cannot be overstated. Their work has paved the way for artists such as Portishead, Radiohead, and Lana Del Rey, who have drawn inspiration from their atmospheric soundscapes. Their music has been featured in numerous films and television series, underscoring its universal appeal and adaptability. FERRARA SUMMER FESTIVAL The Ferrara Summer Festival, born in 2021, when many important Italian artists performed on stage, was conceived as a way to enhance the city's cultural offerings and attract visitors from around the globe. The music festival combines high-quality performances with the charm of Ferrara's historical setting, creating an unforgettable experience for attendees. PIAZZA ARIOSTEA Piazza Ariostea, formerly known as Piazza Nuova and, for a brief period, Piazza Napoleone, is a square in Ferrara, located in the northern part of the historical center of the city. The square has a rectangular shape with a lowered central ring made in 1933 for the Fallo race. At the center of the square stands the 16th-century column designed by Ercole Grandi, on which, since 1833, the statue of Ludovico Ariosto was placed. Piazza Ariostea is located about 2 kilometers away from the Ferrara railway station. The closest bus stop is Porta Mare Ariostea, on the northern side of the square, on the bus Lines 3 and 4.
