Whether you're hoping to integrate pink into a modern, minimalist, traditional, edgy, or contemporary space, and go all out with paint or just want to add an accent piece, the 16 examples of pink room color combinations ahead will lead the way to a chicer home. 1 of 16 Orange Pink zellige floor tiles and a marble vanity with swirls of pink are even further emboldened by the tropical orange cabinets in this small bathroom designed by ETC.etera. 2 of 16 Eggplant A dark eggplant tone will pair beautifully with lavender, lilac, and bubblegum pink. In this bedroom designed by Corey Damen Jenkins, the patterned wallpaper and antique rug feature tons of different shades of purple and pink, for a cohesive yet endlessly dynamic space. 3 of 16 Greige Designer Jae Joo opted for a soft, transitional palette in this 1885 Boston living room. The light pink armchairs add some playful buoyancy to the dark wood pieces while also bringing out the warmer tones in the versatile neutral backdrop. This is the perfect blueprint to follow if you're looking for a way to decorate with pink that still feels timeless, polished, and somewhat formal. 4 of 16 Sapphire Blue This sitting room by Katie Ridder proves just how much opposites attract. The hot pink paint color paired with sapphire blue artwork and a sky blue sofa create a jewel-toned effect. Add in another gemstone shade like citrine for maximum impact. 5 of 16 Lavender Can't decide between your two favorite colors? You don't have to. Pops of lilac and lavender look romantic and stylish mixed with pink. Designer Kureck Jones opted for bubblegum pink subway tiles on the wall and the diamond, almost leaf-like motif on the floors of this bathroom. The brass industrial-style fixtures and lighting add just enough contrast and the pop of pale purple paint is the cherry on top. 6 of 16 Black In this living room designed by Nicole Hollis Studio, an ultra pale pink velvet sofa feels decidedly grown-up and understated paired with moody black artwork, a marble mantel, and a low-to-the-ground coffee table while the casual rug makes the space feel warm and inviting. 7 of 16 Dark Teal Tone down the sweetness of pink with a deep navy blue or dark teal. It'll keep things from feeling too frilly and light. In this coastal home designed by Arent & Pyke, the blush pink linens go beautifully with the steel gray and navy accents. 8 of 16 Lemon Yellow Can you imagine a more sunny, cheerful space? Didn't think so. This bedroom by Anna Spiro Design is about as energizing as bedrooms get, thanks to the playful bubblegum painted walls and lemon yellow accents, like the table lamp base and artwork. 9 of 16 Lime Green In this bedroom designed by Lisa Tharp, the lime green folding screen adds dimension and depth, while also introducing contrast against the peach-hued curtains and copper light fixture. 10 of 16 Baby Blue The staples in this contemporary living room by interior design Bunny Williams and Ferguson & Shamamian Architects are strictly neutral, from the crisp white paint to the cream seating and coffee table. This works with the existing exposed brick rather than clashing with it and allows for new color schemes to come and go with accent pieces over the years. To spice up the color scheme, they added hot pink (a fun warm color to speak to the brick wall beyond) and baby blue for a cool touch. 11 of 16 White Blue and white aren't the only colors that work like magic in a beach house. This coastal escape designed by Tamsin Johnson Interiors is dominated by pink and white, and asserts its sense of place via some beachy materials, like rattan and jute. 12 of 16 Chocolate Brown Lipstick pink might not be the most obvious of wall color choices, but in this 19th-century Brooklyn townhouse, it's a total showstopper. Designer Jonathan Berger, who used Benjamin Moore's Razzle Daz, played up the historic glamour with a Louis XV chair and table and an 18th-century Italian mirror. Pairing pink with brown grounds the over-the-top energy of pink without overshadowing it. 13 of 16 Brass and Gold Brass, gold, and all things shiny are such perfect pairings in a light pink and coral-dominated space. This hallway designed by Janie Molster becomes so much more than just a way to get from point A to point B, thanks to all the metallic accents and bold use of color. 14 of 16 Dark Gray-Green An earthy green helps ground dainty shades of pink as well as more bold shades, like the ones featured in this vignette by Tamsin Johnson. We suggest balancing vibrant pops of pink with can more muted greens. Johnson incorporated this earthy green through glass lighting, details in the painting, and a contrasting throw pillow. 15 of 16 Mairgold In this eclectic bedroom by Raji RM, the tall ceilings, crisp white paint, and long sheers accentuate the height of the space, while all the other furniture was kept super low for a grounding effect. A framed sepia artwork, wood side table, and marigold pillow introduce warmth, while the magenta throw blanket is a fun surprise. 16 of 16 Light Gray Balance warmth and energy with rest and coolness by adding in some gray elements. Here, Janie Molster opted for a pale gray backdrop and some complementary accent chairs. Patrick Cline Purple represents wisdom, royalty, peace, mystery, magic, creativity, loyalty, and ambition, and if we can't be purple, we can at least use it in our homes. Not to mention, purple meets at the intersection of peaceful, calming blue and bold, passionate red for a beautiful blend. While it may not be the most obvious or popular color in the rainbow when it comes to decorating, it is easily the most interesting. But what colors complement purple best? Keep reading to discover which colors go best with purple to inspire your own interiors. 1 of 15 Black In this contemporary sitting room designed by Shapeless Studio, the deep mauve walls set an intimate mood. The inky-black accents and charcoal sofa deepen that vibe, while the lighter pink and cream elements soften things up just enough. 2 of 15 Orange Color Theory 101: Opposites attract. This whimsical, pattern-packed living room by Anna Spiro Design is all the proof we need. The energizing orange sofa warms up the soft lavender throughout, creating the perfect visual balance. 3 of 15 Baby Blue Heather Hilliard gave the more traditional elements in this hallway—like the elaborate gilt mirror and oak console—a playful counterpoint with sky-blue grass-cloth wallpaper and a ginger jar table lamp with a grape-toned pleated shade. The pretty purple lilac blossoms are a nice touch too. 4 of 15 Dusty Rose A wavy, rounded iris area rug is further emboldened by a corresponding painting with pops of red in this living room by 2LG Studio. The soft, dusty-pink painted walls assert a sophisticated backdrop without disrupting the overall sweetness of the space. 5 of 15 Pastel Yellow Designed by Katherine M. Ireland, these twin beds are topped with pastel purple-and-green canopies for a springlike touch. The canopy toppers offer a slight contrast in print but keep the Easter egg color story consistent. The more prominent hue, pastel yellow, goes so nicely with the purples throughout. 6 of 15 Charcoal In this chic, swanky kitchen nook by Kingston Lafferty Design, the mosaic of colorful handmade tiles extends overhead. This makes the niche pop, not disappear into the corner. And the gray chalk paint brings in a smoky sophistication, complementing the gold accents and plum paint. 7 of 15 Royal Blue This dining room by Redmond Aldrich Design is a sublime blend of modern and traditional thanks to the multi-size paper pendants and elaborate turn-of-the-century ceiling. We adore the bursts of purple balanced by the rich yellows in the carpet and the vibrant blue dining chairs. 8 of 15 Dark Brown The deep chocolate brown-purple hues in this study designed by Studio DB ensure a sense of intimacy and a suggestion of drama while still being timeless. The cooler blues in the painting bring in just a splash of contrast too. 9 of 15 Cantaloupe Swirling lavender motifs make this kitchen, designed by Erin Martin, romantic and more than a touch theatrical, while the warm Creamsicle orange background is in keeping with the farmhouse bones of the space. 10 of 15 Light Gray This lavender oasis designed by Cathy Chapman presents a strong case for monochromatic purple decorating. The key: Stick to a color story of muted pastels and use just the right neutral—in this case, light gray. 11 of 15 Marigold Not only is the deep blue paint a lovely and bold color for this living room by Kate Reid, but its high-gloss finish also adds some extra punch. And she doesn't stop there: The marigold curtains and rich orchid armchair contribute to the jewel-toned palette too. 12 of 15 Red Concrete gets a lot of flack for making a space feel cold rather than homey, while purple and red together have an unfair reputation for resembling a garish Valentine's Day card. But leave it to designer Briony Fitzgerald to prove all the nonbelievers wrong. Vibrant abstract art paired with a traditional console table results in a unique, beautiful blend of old and new, moody and cheerful. 13 of 15 Forest Green This bathroom designed by Studio DB has a sexy allure, which is achieved by matching an eggplant-purple bathtub with a metallic wallpaper panel that features a sleek panther and is flanked by forest green-painted walls. 14 of 15 Turquoise A statement wall or ceiling in a fun shade like amethyst is a great way to keep things fresh and interesting. We're loving how this ceiling contrasts with the rustic turquoise pieces and classic red barrel chairs in this cozy nook. 15 of 15 Gold The flecks of purple in this panel of gold wallpaper are accentuated by the baby-pink ceiling and lavender carafe and tumbler set.
