This means that you can take advantage of the free trial endlessly as long as you’re OK churning through emails. An Amazon customer service rep confirmed to us that a new email is all you need to qualify for the promotional period. If you’re a student, the free trial lasts for six months. Since you have to have a .edu email to take advantage of a student membership, you probably can’t keep this hack up for years. But some schools allow you to create alias accounts or simply assign you multiple user names—if that’s the case, you can sign up for the free trial multiple times. Unfortunately, you do have to enter a credit card when you enroll in Prime, and your account will automatically upgrade to a paid membership when your trial ends. If you don’t want that to happen, either opt out of auto-renewal or set a reminder to cancel. This method is inconvenient and perhaps a questionable way to save \$119 a year, but the fact remains: Amazon seems to be okay with multiple free trials. Pay by the monthOnce your free trial expires, you can pay \$119 once or \$12.99 per month (\$6.49 for students and \$5.99 for EBT and Medicaid cardholders). If the shipping benefits are all you’re after, opt into your membership in months you expect to order a lot (around the holidays, for example) and cancel when you don’t need them. Link your account for shared benefitsAmazon allows up to two adults, four teens and four children to be linked (called a Household) for a single membership fee. This means that if your parent, friend or partner is paying for Prime, you can use the benefits at no additional cost. Or you could simply order using someone else’s account, as Amazon allows you to add multiple credit cards and shipping addresses. The bigger the TV, the more it’ll likely cost you, and the higher the chance you’ll run into space constraint issues with your home setup. You might even need to buy a new entertainment center if you get an especially big TV. Of course, size isn’t the only factor. You’ll also need to consider whether a great 4K TV is really a necessity; after all, how much 4K content do you really consume? That answer may soon change if you plan on picking up one of the upcoming next-gen gaming consoles, both of which put a heavy emphasis on 4K gaming, but it’s a question worth asking yourself either way. It’s also worth noting that streaming services like Netflix are continuing to expand their libraries of 4K content. Speaking of gaming consoles, you should think about how many HDMI ports you might—which really means you should think about how many devices you plan on connecting to your TV at once. It features newer HDR and color processing, and I think it nicely balances its price against its features, size, and resolution.
